## Amin awarded SPIE Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship

BELLINGHAM, Washington, USA – June 3, 2019 – **Rubab Amin** has been awarded a 2019 Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship by SPIE, the international society for optics and photonics, for his potential contributions to the field of optics, photonics or related field.



Rubab is a doctoral candidate and member of the OPEN Lab team at George Washington University (USA). His research is focused on design and demonstration of novel nanoscale electro-optic integrated modulators on Si-photonic platform. "Through design and optimization of these miniature devices dictated by physical tradeoffs and nanofabrication constraints, my goal is to enhance the light-matter interaction in the active material to achieve unprecedented performances in modulation," said Amin. He has demonstrated the first Si-integrated ITO-based Mach-Zehnder modulator recently. Amin holds a number of leadership positions including the post of the vice-president for GWU OSA/SPIE student chapter.

The Society awarded \$298,000 in education scholarships to 84 outstanding SPIE student members, based on their potential contribution to optics and photonics, or a related discipline. Award-winning applicants were evaluated, selected and approved by the SPIE Scholarship Committee, Chaired by SPIE volunteer Jeremy Bos.

Through 2018, SPIE has distributed \$6 million dollars in individual scholarships. This ambitious effort reflects the Society's commitment to education and to the next generation of optical scientists and engineers around the world.
